

To the friends of UPLIFT

Dearly loved friends,

Our dear Gunnar sent us a group photo we took during graduation. It made me remember all the friends of UPLIFT and think perhaps you might like to know where we are in the achievement of this year's goals related to the Sub counties of training, numbers of learners, mentors, and refresher courses for mentors. The following is a summary of the present status of the goals, per end of March 2014.

We have other goals that do not appear in the above table. These goals included community meeting, purchase of net balls and footballs, tree planting, and purchase of books. The status of these goals may be summarized as shown below.

Hold 33 Community meetings to ensure government and community participation	33 community meetings were held; 17 in Nebbi, 17 in Zombo. Because of the meetings many classes are held in schools, churches, and community centres free of charge in support for literacy provision
Purchase 25 net balls and 25 footballs for the youth	The 50 balls were purchased and sent
Plant 6000 trees in the year 2014	500 trees have been planted and the working of planting more is going on
Enroll 6 learners for tailoring school; 3 for Nebbi and 3 for Zombo	The 6 learners have been enrolled for the tailoring school and are doing well

Purchase 1750 books 1700 for learners and 50 for information centre and training	800 have been purchased and sent
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### Concluding Comments

Our goal of enrollment of learners for this year was 1700 learners. The number is slightly higher because we expect some of the learners to drop out in the course of the year. We opened 2 new Sub-counties this year one in Nebbi, - Ndeu; and one in Zombo, - Atyak. This was because we could not get enough learners in the old areas. The literacy program has been very well received in all areas especially in the two new areas.
